Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

My husband and I love our baby girl. Because we love our daughter, we don't always let her get her own way. Instead, we teach our child discipline and reward good behaviour. This can be a challenge in a society where children receive too much power without having the emotional and intellectual maturity to go with it. Children look to their parents to discover who they are and that they are loved. We are God's children and He loves us infinitely more than we can imagine. He is a faithful father and He disciplines us because He wants to heal us. We are called to strive for holiness, to enter through the narrow door. The way to heaven isn't easy, but walking the path is fruitful and worth the effort. The author of the letter to the Hebrews writes that we should not be discouraged or lose hope during God's loving discipline, but rather receive it with the knowledge that it's for our own benefit and healing.

During today's eucharistic celebration, thank the Lord for His endless fatherly love for us. Look to Him and talk with Him as children speak with their parents. Pray for the wisdom to recognize His fatherly discipline and the courage to accept it.

Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Bookstore shelves today are lined with titles on self-improvement, building self-esteem and assertiveness skills, and how to win. Smartphones put the world at our finger tips. We get impatient when we don't immediately get what we want or have to wait in line. Jesus says that in His kingdom the last will be first and those who pushed their way to the front will be relegated to the cheap seats.

Jesus is radical in His challenge as He faces the power-brokers of His time. Put others ahead of yourself and reach out to those who can't necessarily reciprocate. As I try to apply this teaching, I realize it's asking a lot of me.

How I operate socially and whom I invite to dinner indicate the type of person I am. How I move from self-centeredness to being othercentered is a challenge. As my relationship with God grows, I realize He loves me. I am developing a healthier acceptance of my strengths and limitations. At this Eucharist I give thanks that God dwells within me. I don't need to be first in line; I don't need the best seat in the house. The knowledge that God loves me unconditionally allows me to let others cut in front without my getting upset.

Accustom yourself continually to make many acts of love, for they enkindle and melt the soul.
